

Mr. Campbell:

- He has been assisting the Pikes Peak Workforce (PPWF) with its federal audit.
- He has been attending meetings with Colorado Technical Services, Inc (CTSI).
- He participated in many activities at the Teller County Fair with the other Commissioners, including judging and grading 4-H participants, attended the livestock auction, and they served over 300 steak dinners to buyers and participants involved with the livestock auction. He is looking forward to the fairgrounds renovations to occur in the upcoming year. He thanked the Fair Board and volunteers for their coordination and efforts.
- Reported that the Commissioners met as the County Board of Equalization (CBOE) last week to make final determinations of value on appeals of property valuations.

Mr. Stone:

- Reported on the CBOE hearings last week on over 150 accounts and discussed the statutory role of the CBOE and the requirement to use market values.
- Attended a Pikes Peak Area Council of Governments (PPACG) meeting and received updates on highway construction projects. The Highway 24 project from Green Mountain Falls to Edlowe Road is approximately 1/3 complete; the project on north Highway 67 is occasionally down to one lane causing delays; the road closures in Florissant Canyon are complete but some roadwork is still ongoing; and that the Colorado Department of Transportation is investing funds for highway projects in Teller County.
- PPACG is preparing for the next legislative session, and he is on a committee that will recommend changes to the Construction Defect Action Reform Act (CDARA) to make it affordable to build condominiums in Colorado. This committee hosted a successful stakeholders meeting with the State Homebuilders Association, Pikes Peak Homebuilders Association, South Denver Metro Housing Association, County Commissioners from the Front Range, and legislators.
- Commented on the County Fair and praised the 4-H kids for how they worked and helped each other as a team. Reported that the Commissioners purchased 4 animals and the auction: 2 sheep, a pig and a steer.

Elected Officials Report:

Mark Czelusta, Treasurer/Public Trustee

- Gave update on tax collections.
- His office is preparing for the tax lien sales in November, and he explained the statutory process of how to participate in the tax lien sale.

Carol Kittelson, Assessor

- Thanked the Commissioners, administration, IT and Clerk and Recorder's office for their assistance in working on the County Board of Equalization hearings.
- Reported that her staff appraisers will resume their work in the field doing property appraisals and they will be readily identifiable with Teller County Assessor's Office apparel and will carry their office identification and credentials.
